## Pandemic triggered disorders in children's behaviour: Experts

Kolkata: There has been a huge surge in the number of children with developmental and behavioural disorders across cities, including Kolkata, during Covid, which resulted in a rush for ireatment ower the last eight months, according to developmental paediatricians who attended a two-day meet in the city over the weekend. The number of children being treated for learning disability, Down's syndrome, autientical and cerebral palsy has doubled, they pointed out, with many suffering irreversible damages due to a sudden Covid-induced delay and break in diagnosis and treatment.

There is now a sharp focus on developmental paediatrics due to the sheer number of youngster's suffering from the issues related to it, said Mumbal-based developmental paediatrician Samir Dalwal, who attended the National Conference on Developmental Paediatrics organised by Indian Academy of Paediatrics (AP).

A significant number of children with autien and learning disability had not been identified while those with Down's syndrome or cerebral paisy had a break in treatment or a delay. These have turned very costly for some and there is now a desperation to seek medical help. Nationally, the number of such children now under treatment has doubled compared to the pre-Covid period. Said Dalwais.

"Today, the need of the hour is to spread awareness about developmental milestones so that parents and caregivers can spot the red flags," said Minu Budhia, psychotherapist and founder of Rolkata-based Carins Minds.
